Our aim is to support children and families suffering the effects of disadvantage and to improve their lives, promote their healthy development and help them to reach their potential.

We do this by working with the whole family, enabling them to draw on their strengths to take control of their lives. We aim to enhance the dignity and self-respect of all those who use our services. We strive to work in partnership with other organisations to deliver supportive services that invest in families and promote the best possible start in life for children, ensuring that they reach key developmental and educational milestones.

The backdrop to the past year has continued to be one of challenge for Circle and the voluntary sector as a whole. This has meant that we have had to be even more committed and resourceful in maintaining, and in some instances growing, the services that help to support and develop some of the most marginalised families in Scotland.

- Pregnant mothers affected by substance use


"If I didn't have (Circle Worker) my life would be as bad as it was when I took heroin. If I'm honest, I don't think I'd be alive." (Parent)


Circle is a learning organisation and through our Practice Learning & Development, we provided 12 placements to Social Work students during 2019-20.
